Funding Program Overview

Alberta Sports Connection

Wheelchair Sports Alberta continues to receive provincial sport organization funding by Alberta Sports Connection Core Block and Canada Games grants.

Grants

WSA was approved for a \$28,000 grant to purchase equipment for a program to run in Fort McMurray. We also purchased the athletics equipment from the 2017 CIP grant in 2018. A grant was received from Canada Summer Jobs in support of bringing in a summer Marketing and Administration position. This student helped with Rugby Nationals, social media, and some coaching templates. .



Fundraising

WSA built a relationship with Zenith Advertising in May of 2018. We have a door to door campaign in Calgary as well as tables set up in different grocery stores throughout the city. In Edmonton we are collecting donations throughout the city in grocery stores. We are looking forward to what this relationship will do for us in the future.

AGLC

We were fortunate to be able to have our AGLC funds available to purchase Team Alberta flights, hotels, facility rentals, and equipment. We are looking forward to our 2019 casino, to earn more funds to support our charity!



WSA's Grant Program

WSA gave our \$14,841.00 in individual and organization grants. With this funding we supported our high performance athletes with equipment purchases, program fees, technical training, and more. We were able to support our clubs and organizations who are hosting events, bringing in national coaches to develop their club teams, and purchasing equipment.

BRIDGING THE GAP PROGRAM

In all BTG activities: Rehab Sports Program, Have-A-Go Days, Multi-Sport Events, Developmental Sessions, and School Presentations/Demonstrations. We continue to promote the WSA core sports while maintaining a fun atmosphere where participants and community members can enjoy a wide variety of adapted leisure activities. Bringing in peer athletes is key to delivering effective sport programming. It gives the participants a chance to interact with people with similar injuries and those who can describe the positive impact of wheelchair sports.

Rehab Wheelchair Sports Programs

Calgary, AB—Continued efforts are in place to establish a continuous program at or near a hospital or rehabilitation center. Issues around a similar program to the Glenrose WC Sports night is many of the facilities in Calgary do not have the required spaces needed to host activities.

Glenrose WC Sports Night— We have found tremendous success at the Glenrose programming since 2017. We continued relationships with the Wheelchair Curling club in Edmonton who provided us with indoor equipment to put on wheelchair curling. Our core four volunteers have been amazing over the past 18 months which has seen consistent attendance (6-12 individuals) by both in/out patients of the Glenrose Hospital each week.

DEVELOPMENTAL PROGRAMS

Edmonton & Calgary Wheelchair Basketball – We continue to work with the WSA Regional Wheelchair Basketball Reps to funnel adult and junior participants into the weekly development program at Mount Royal and the Saville Centre.

Edmonton Wheelchair Tennis Program – The weekly program at Osten & Victor and the Saville Centre ran throughout 2018 with consistent regular participant numbers all year. 4-8 Participants per week each.

Wheelchair Tennis Tournament - 5 athletes registered . We had a Men's Singles Draw (4 participants) and a Men's Doubles Draw (2 doubles teams).

Wheelchair Rugby— We held an inter provincial competition in November and had an excellent turnout from both teams. As a province, both teams saw growth in their participant numbers and competition opportunities.

Have-A-Go Days and Multi-Sport Events

While using the LTAD model we focus on introducing new fundamental movement skills to participants through all levels of physical impairment.

Have a Go Day/ Multi Sports Events—127 Participants

Weekly Programs (Rehab & Tennis) - 181 Participants

School and Awareness Programs—346 Participants



PARA ATHLETICS



Para athletics across the province has continued to grow largely due to the relationship with Athletics Alberta and the Community Initiatives Program Grant in 2017. As a result of the grant we were able to buy 10 chairs and 6 training rollers all of which have been distributed into the community.



Overall, our athletes have continued their development in 2018 with many setting personal records. In 2019, athletics will look to build on this success as well as try to recruit more individuals through Have-A-Go Days.



In May of 2018, in coordination with Athletics Alberta, we hosted a small coaching clinic in which we brought in former National Coach Ueli Albert. This clinic included current and prospective coaches to give them more hands on experience when working with new athletes. This coaching clinic was very well received by those who attended the clinic.

The athletics program will continue to develop leading into the 2019 Western Canada Summer Games in Saskatoon, SK. Our Para athletes participate in several meets throughout the year, including indoor and outdoor events. Our athletes also participated at the National Championships, Tri Provincials, High School Provincials, and Provincials.



WHEELCHAIR TENNIS

Tennis has continued to see success in the province largely due to the Birmingham National Wheelchair Tennis Championships being held in Calgary for the 2nd consecutive year in their final year of the two year commitment. Success, with two tournaments has lead to the opportunity to include a wheelchair division in multiple 2019 tournaments.

106th Alberta Open

This was the first time that the Alberta Open has included a Wheelchair Division in the tournament. Overall, we had 7 athletes compete in the tournament including three athletes that have never competed in a tennis tournament before.

2018 Nationals

The Osten and Victor Alberta Tennis Centre once again hosted the 2018 Birmingham National Wheelchair Tennis Championships. We had ten athletes representing Alberta.

Team Alberta - Junior (U23) Program


Team Alberta defended their 2018 Junior National Championship Gold Metal with a strong performance at the 2019 Canada Winter Games in Red Deer. This was the first time that Alberta won gold metal at the Canada Winter Games since 1995 in Grand Prairie. The team was lead by Brandon Doll (Camrose) who was the 2018 MVP. The team faced a strong Ontario team in the last game of the round robin and once again in the Gold Metal Game. The team went 6-0 throughout the tournament. The team will now start to rebuild the team that will have 6 players that are eligible to return to the 2023 Canada Winter Games.

2017-2018 rugby season was a good one for Wheelchair Rugby in Alberta highlighted by the success at the 2018 National Championships in Calgary, AB . Club teams from Edmonton and Calgary competed in multiple tournaments and each hosted a tournament.

Edmonton Report:

Edmonton Steel Wheels attended 4 tournaments this season. Two tournaments in the USA (Reno NV and Dallas TX) and two tournaments in the prairie league in Calgary and Saskatoon and hosted the 2018 Capital City Showdown.

The club had good finishes in all the tournaments highlighted by a 2nd place finish in Dallas. The team is going through a rebuilding process but the developing players are continuing to get stronger each tournament.

Calgary Report:

Calgary Inferno attended multiple tournaments in 2018 and hosted their annual tournament. Due to the additional costs the team did not attend any tournaments in the USA. The team continues to see good player development and we are looking forward for this trend to continue. The player development is due to the strong veteran core and consistent attendance at practices. .

PROVINCIAL REPORT

We selected 14 great athletes to be on our two provincial teams in 2018. At the end of March each team went to Vancouver to play in the annual Vancouver Invitational Tournament in which both teams got valuable playing time together in preparation for the 2018 National Championships in Calgary. The tournament in Vancouver was a huge part of why Alberta won Silver in Division 1 and Bronze in Division 2. This was the first time that Alberta has played for the Gold Metal in division 1.
