About Wheelchair Sports Alberta (WSA)

WSA is a provincial non-profit creating lifelong adaptive sport opportunities for children, youth, and adults with disabilities. We support wheelchair basketball, wheelchair rugby, and para hockey while collaborating with schools, healthcare partners, and local clubs.

Bridging the Gap (BTG) introduces individuals with disabilities to adaptive sport and supports their transition into long-term recreation and sport pathways.

Position Overview

The Program Manager – Bridging the Gap oversees all BTG programming across Alberta:

Key Duties:

- Recruitment-focused events, "Try-It" days, and Have-A-Go events
- School & community presentations
- Sport demonstrations and weekly drop-ins

Role Responsibilities:

- Program delivery & supervision of staff/volunteers
- Partnership development with hospitals, schools, and sport clubs
- Financial oversight, grant reporting, and budgeting
- Provincial travel for program delivery

Key Responsibilities

Program Administration (40%)

- Maintain participant database and annual schedules
- Coordinate logistics: facilities, transportation, catering, volunteers
- Support provincial teams and local clubs

Presentations & Outreach (20%)

- Present BTG program info to schools and healthcare professionals
- Conduct 1:1 meetings with participants/families
- Expand program reach into new regions

Partnerships & Engagement (15%)

- Build relationships with hospitals, rehab centres, therapists, and sport clubs
- Attend interagency meetings to strengthen referral pathways

Communication (10%)

• Update BTG content online, respond to inquiries, produce newsletters

Reporting & Finance (15%)

- Submit monthly/quarterly reports to WSA Board and National BTG Coordinator
- Budget reconciliation and support for event/program budgets

- Diploma in Recreation or related field
- 1+ years program delivery; 1+ year supervising staff/volunteers
- Budget & grant reconciliation experience
- Strong communication, presentation, and relationship-building skills
- Valid driver's license & availability for evenings/weekends
- Commitment to Safe Sport and disability inclusion

- 3+ years adaptive sport or disability recreation experience
